 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "NIH Implementing
 - 5 a Maternal health and PRegnancy Outcomes Vision for
- 6 Everyone" or the "NIH IMPROVE Act".

Subpart 7 of part C of title IV of the Public Health
Service Act (42 U.S.C. 281 et seq.) is amended by adding
at the end the following:
"SEC. 452H. IMPROVE INITIATIVE.
"(a) In General.—The Director of the Institute
shall continue to carry out the IMPROVE initiative (re-
ferred to in this section as the 'Initiative') through the
Institute for the following:
"(1) Advancing research to—
"(A) reduce preventable causes of maternal
mortality and severe maternal morbidity;
"(B) reduce racial, ethnic, geographic, and
socioeconomic disparities in maternal health
outcomes; and
"(C) improve health for pregnant and
postpartum individuals before, during, and after
pregnancy.
"(2) Using an integrated approach to under-
stand the biological, behavioral, sociocultural, and
structural factors that affect maternal mortality and
severe maternal morbidity by building an evidence
base for improved care and outcomes in specific re-

gions of the United States.

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1	"(3) Targeting health disparities associated
2	with maternal mortality and severe maternal mor-
3	bidity by—
4	"(A) implementing and evaluating commu-
5	nity-based interventions for disproportionately
6	affected individuals; and
7	"(B) identifying risk factors and the un-
8	derlying biological mechanisms associated with
9	leading causes of maternal mortality and severe
10	maternal morbidity in the United States, in-
11	cluding cardiovascular disease, infection and
12	immunity, vitamin and nutrient deficiencies,
13	and mental and behavioral health.
14	"(b) Implementation.—The Director of the Insti-
15	tute may award grants or enter into contracts, cooperative
16	agreements, or other transactions to carry out subsection
17	(a), including with researchers from racial and ethnic mi-
18	nority groups (as defined in section $1707(g)(1)$).
19	"(c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
20	is authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
21	\$53,400,000 for each of fiscal years 2025 through 2031.".
