

FY26 Labor, Health and Human Services Wins

Alabama Wins Directly Secured by Senator Britt:

\$28.6 million for medical and research equipment at hospitals and universities, workforce development training, nursing education, mobile health units, and more —

- **\$3,000,000** to the City of Enterprise for surgical robot procurement and installation
- **\$300,000** for ambulance procurement for Coosa County Emergency Medical Service
- **\$2,500,000** for surgical robot procurement at Cullman Regional Medical Center
- **\$1,305,000** to Faulkner University for equipment and vehicle procurement for mobile wellness unit
- **\$500,000** for surgical and lab equipment procurement for the Health Care Authority of the City of Eufaula
- **\$500,000** for mammography and CT scanner procurement for the Monroe County Hospital
- **\$2,000,000** biotechnology research equipment acquisition for the Southern Research Institute
- **\$1,667,000** for CT scanner procurement and installation at St. Vincent's Blount
- **\$1,024,000** for nursing education equipment procurement at the University of North Alabama
- **\$2,000,000** addiction treatment and therapy equipment acquisition for Veterans Recovery Resources
- **\$5,746,000** for system-wide workforce development programming at Alabama Community College System
- **\$5,290,000** for Aerospace and Aero-technology Program, including student scholarships at Tuskegee University

More Alabama Wins Senator Britt helped to secure:

- A **\$2 million** increase (\$66.3 million) for the Rural Hospital Flexibility Grants in HRSA.

FY26 Transportation, Housing and Urban Development, and Related Agencies Wins

Alabama Wins Directly Secured by Senator Britt:

\$68.5 million for road and bridge projects, airport and rail infrastructure, public safety and emergency services, and technology and innovation investments —

- **\$100,000** to ALDOT for County Road 387 Cost Analysis.
- **\$2,000,000** to ALDOT for the engineering, design, and construction of a bridge replacement on Highway 77 in Southside, AL.
- **\$2,000,000** to ALDOT for CR 64 capacity and safety improvements in Baldwin County, AL.
- **\$1,000,000** to ALDOT to replace the bridge over Muscadine Creek in Cleburne County, AL.
- **\$1,020,000** to ALDOT to replace the Depot Street Bridge in Riverside, AL.
- **\$1,000,000** to ALDOT to widen and resurface CR 21 in Hale County, AL.
- **\$1,000,000** to ALDOT for the widening and planning of Mooresville Road in Limestone County, AL.
- **\$2,000,000** to ALDOT to replace the Sparkman Drive Bridge in Huntsville, AL.

- **\$2,000,000** to the Alabama State Port Authority for the Mobile Port's railroad expansion.
- **\$850,000** to the Alabama State Port Authority for facilities modernization and Pier 02 Berth Competition.
- **\$2,000,000** to the Alabama State Port Authority for McDuffie Coal Terminal Modernization.
- **\$2,355,000** to fund the needed infrastructure improvements on airport property for the City of Enterprise.
- **\$3,000,000** to Mobile Airport Authority for airfield tarmac improvements.
- **\$4,000,000** to fund the rehabilitation of airport aprons at the Bessemer Airport Authority.
- **\$1,000,000** to fund security infrastructure improvements in the City of Evergreen.
- **\$1,145,000** for the Montgomery Regional Airport to fund the rehabilitation of the airport's primary runway.
- **\$3,850,000** to the Chilton County Airport Authority for the funding in support of the runway extension project.
- **\$400,000** for new runway lights at Perry County Airport.
- **\$500,000** for airport operations and safety improvements at Fairhope Airport.
- **\$150,000** for improved and additional fire equipment at Gulf Shores International Airport.
- **\$1,650,000** to the City of Montgomery for the Montgomery Regional Tech & Innovation Ecosystem Initiative (MRTIEI) Hub.
- **\$300,000** to the City of Talladega for transportation infrastructure for the Deaf and Blind.
- **\$1,500,000** to the City of Abbeville for public safety firefighting equipment.
- **\$10,000,000** to the University of Alabama Huntsville for Artificial Intelligence Research Infrastructure.

More Alabama Wins Senator Britt helped to secure:

- **\$10 million** for the National Scenic Byways Program, Alabama's National Scenic Byways include: Alabama's Coastal Connection, Natchez Trace Parkway, Selma to Montgomery March Byway, and Talladega Scenic Drive.
- **\$20 million** for the Appalachian Development Highway System (ADHS) which includes the Birmingham Northern Beltline. Alabama has the most eligible miles left of any state in the system.
- Report language to address uncertified air charters – To express concerns about uncertified air charters, also referred to as illegal charters, conducting commercial flights in violation of FAA regulations.
- Report language to address cargo theft – To recognize the substantial increase in cargo theft that has affected the transportation supply chain over the last few years.

FY26 Financial Services and General Government (FSGG) Appropriations Act

Alabama Wins Directly Secured by Senator Britt:

\$14.2 million for critical repairs at the Dothan Courthouse and Hugo Black Courthouse, and for the University of North Alabama and Athens State University to expand and enhance their innovation and entrepreneurial centers —

- **\$5 million** for critical repairs to the Dothan Courthouse.
- **\$4 million** for critical repairs to the Hugo Black Courthouse.
- **\$5 million** for the University of North Alabama to expand services offered at the Joel R. Anderson Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurial Studies.
- **\$205,000** for Athens State University to expand and enhance its innovation and entrepreneurial center, the LaunchBox.
